It was another assembly, another opportunity to miss class, another hour to avoid lectures and essays and math problems. It was a chance for students to hang out with their friends and relax, and that was enough. The students of Bellville High School were happy simply to have a break in their school day. But then, the guest speaker began to talk and the mood changed drastically. Mesmerized, 700 students listened intently as Gary Horton of the American Freedom Assembly entertained, challenged, and motivated them with witty jokes, inspiring anecdotes, and the truth.

Wearing blue jeans, a black sweatshirt, dark glasses, and a contagious sense of humor, Gary confidently strolled on stage and immediately interacted with the kids. He made them smile and continently strolled on stage and immediately interacted with the kids. The made their simile and laugh, and then he began to teach, not with lecture but with life. Sharing his experiences in his straightforward style, he told them what they needed to hear, and they listened. He told them it wasn't their fault that our country was in trouble, but they did have responsibility to make it better; he told them that teachers were hurt when students disrupted the class, and they needed to stop disturbing the learning environment; he told them they could build up their life or tear it down, and they had to chose correctly. Gary showed them that they mattered, and they believed

Reciting poetry that reminded them of what patriotism actually is, he encouraged them to rethink their definition of a hero and to ask: "If every American was just like me, what kind of America would America be?" And as he continued speaking about attitude, motivation, enthusiasm, respect, integrity, courage, and ambition, the lessons he taught stayed with our students, who still speak with appreciation of the man they heard on the auditorium stage that day.

At the hour's end, the audience cheered, but the standing ovation was only a respectful symbol; the real change took place in the hearts of the students and of our faculty as we applauded a man whose life was making a difference in ours, beginning with that one moment when all the students really wanted to do was get out of class. As principal, I'm grateful for Gary, for what he accomplished, and for the power of his message. 
Our door is always open for you. Please feel free to visit McLaurin High School anytime you are in this area.


